

## CURTAIN HEADINGS



PENCIL PLEAT

A pencil pleat heading is the simplest, most versatile type of curtain heading. The elegant slim folds can create a smart formal window dressing, but also look great in a relaxed setting. The pleats are created by pulling on cords to create an even gathering, which can be altered to fit a slightly wider or narrow window if they need to be moved.

Suitable for both curtain tracks and poles.



PINCH PLEAT

A pinch pleat heading helps create a formal ambiance in the dining room, hall or master bedroom. The pleats are held in place with stitching, so the curtain width cannot be altered. The pleats can be made to any size but are generally 3" or 5" for a longer drop.

Suitable for both curtain tracks and poles.



GOBLET

A goblet heading creates a sumptuous statement in a formal room and works well with heavier fabrics. To keep their shape, the goblets are usually no deeper than 10cm. This type of heading is not advisable for smaller windows as the curtains tend not to stack back as well.

Suitable for both curtain tracks and poles.



EYELET

A great way of creating a modern look, eyelet curtains hang in wide loose folds. Eyelets are available in a range of finishes. Eyelets work well with lighter and heavier fabrics.

Suitable for curtain poles only.



TAB TOP

This contemporary heading has loops of the same or a contrasting fabric sewn to the top of the curtain. Not suitable for rooms where you need to exclude light.

Suitable for curtain poles only.



WAVE

A contemporary style, a wave heading allows curtains to hang in wide, even folds. A specialist Silent Gliss track is used to create this effect.
